The Choir gained First Prize in the 1966 Pontrhydfendigaid Eisteddfod and last year travelled to Switzerland where they won the Prix Populaire at the Montreux International Choral Festival in competition with choirs from all over Europe.

They have recently given concerts with the Forest Philharmonic Orchestra and Morley College Chamber Orchestra, appearing with soloists Margaret Neville, Jennifer Vyvyan, Marjorie Thomas, Ronald Dowd and Benjamin Luxon.
