The Concord Singers started to sing together in early 1966. They are a young amateur group, whose professional backgrounds include teaching, secretaril work, Banking and insurance.

They give frequent concerts in London and other parts of England, and have won major prizes at EisteddFodan. In 1967 they went to Switzerland, where they were awarded a First Prize in the Montreux International Choral Festival.

Their repertoire consists mainly of unaccompanied works in many languages, and of all periods. They have taken a particular interest in the music of Benjamin Britten who, last year, kindly consented to beome their patron.

In 1969, the Concord Singers are planning a concert tour of the North Eastern U. S. A. and Canada with a programme of predominantly English music.
