The choir was started in its present form in 1966. It consists of amateur singers who wish to strive towards a high standard of performance of all types of choral music, although due to its comparatively small size (30 voices approximately) it is not able to attempt some of the larger scale works. The choir which sang for some time under the patronage of Benjamin Britten, has wom prizes at Eisteddfodan and has travelled to the Montreux International Choral Festival where it won a major prize competing against choirs from all over Europe. In 1969, the choir went to Yugoslavia where it performed during the Dubrovnik Summer Festival.

The conductor of the choir, Malcolm Cottle, sang for many years as a boy with the choir of St. Pauls Cathedral, during which time he sang at the Coronation of the Queen, and also toured the U.S.A. with the choir. More recently, as well as conducting the London Concord Singers, he has worked as repetiteur with the New Opera Company at Sadlers Wells Theatre, and also toured as Musical Director with the show "Close the Coalhouse Door" and last Christmas was Musical Director for the Christmas Season at Sheffield Playhouse Theatre.

The programme for the concert consists of a mixture of sacred and secular music including some folk song arrangements, some in the original langauges such as Hungarian and Russian. It also includes a new piece, especially written for us by a young composer from Grimsby.
