# THE\_LONDON\_CONCORD\_SINGERS

The Choir was formed in 1966 and has a wide repertoire of music both ancient and modern, sacred and secular.

They have sung in Switzerland and during the Dubrovnik Summer Festival, have won major prizes including one at the Montreux International Choral Festival and also at Eisteddfods and music festivals in this country.

The Choir made their Purcell Room debut in April this year and will be singing there again next April.

Four Dances from FACADE

The first public performance of Facade was in 1923 and consisted of Edith Sitwell's poetry and Walton's music. Walton later scored some of the pieces for orchestra, independent of the words, in two orchestral suites. The four dances in the present arrangement are Polka, Tango, Popular Song and Tarantella.

Piccolo Concerto in C Major

Vivaldi, who lived at the turn of the seventeenth century
(1680-1743) was an eminent composer of his day and his mustal
style has a virtuosity which greatly influenced later composers.
This Concerto is one of two that he wrote for piccolo.

Air from Suite No. 3 in D Major

It is thought that the four Suites for Orchestra were written while Bach was conductor of the Court Orchestra of Prince Leopold of Anhalt-Coethen (1708-1717). The Air from the Third Suite is scored for strings and harpsichord, the first violins having the well-known tune. This movement is popularly known as the "Air on a G String", after an unauthentic transcription by a later composer.

The Visitor

Words by Clement C Moore

This seasonal piece was written as a natural musical response to the famous words of Clement C Moore. Those unfamiliar with Mr. Warren's style of composition will note that although not influenced by such eminent authorities as Franz Showboat or Syd Belius it does contain some of the flavour of a few other lesser-known composers. Any reference to any composer ling, lead or by way of decomposing is not entirely accidental.

The Running Set"

The Running Set is a dance of British origin still performed in the remoter parts of the United States. Cecil Sharp discovered the dance in 1917, but by this time the original music had been lost and it was danced to any appropriate tune. Vaughan-Williams version is based on four traditional tunes: "Barrack Hill", "The Blackthorn Stick", "Irish Reel" and "Cock o' the North".

Its first performance was at a National Folk Dance Festival at the Royal Albert Hall in 1934.
