LONDON CONCORD SINGERS MUSIC FOR THE MILLENNIUM

Staring in autumn 1997, Music for the Millennium is London Concord Singers' three year project, aimed at performing a wide range of the great unaccompanied choral music from the 20th century. The concert series aims to include a diverse and wide range of great music, both known and unknown.

Audiences can find contemporary music puzzlina and alienating. sometimes showing reluctance to accept the more challenging 20th century works. In order to make the programmes more accessible, we have created each programme with a mixture of 20th Century pieces performed alongside music from the 16th to the 19th century. We have chosen the music to provide a sympathetic context for the contemporary pieces and to give the audience a stimulating mixture of the familiar and the unfamiliar.

LONDON CONCORD SINCERS

London Concord Singers are an award-winning chamber choir of about 30 mixed voices, based in central London, with a broad-ranging repertoire. The choir was established in 1966 by the conductor, Malcolm Cottle and he has remained the Musical Director. The choir became a registered charity in 1996.

London Concord Singers have given a number of world, UK and London premieres of works by composers such as John Rutter, Andrzej Panufnik, Richard Rodney Bennett, John McCabe, Kenneth Leighton and Michael Ball, as well as pieces specially written for the choir.

The choir has also given performances of major contemporary pieces such as Alfred Schnittke's Choral Concerto and Malcolm Williamson's Requiem for a Tribe Brother. In its 30 year history the choir has performed all of the unaccompanied choral music of Francis Poulenc.
